## Happy Anniversary to Us - We've Come a Long Way, Wickie!

Ten years ago this month, the Passport Club website was launched. For the first time extensive information about stamp locations was made available, the Hall of Fame was created and the stamp only (flag) was added to the awards. Prior to that, stamp locations were listed with an address and a phone number and a P (open to the public) or V (only can view). It was all on one line. 269 lighthouses and museums were listed: today there are 727. Maine listed 19 stamps: today there are 71. Michigan listed 26 stamps available: today there are 103! This only reinforces the importance of those people listed above and previous volunteers who worked to keep the website, created 10 years ago, up to date.

## **New Cape Hatteras National Seashore Stamps**

As we have previously announced, our program no longer accepts National Park cancellation stamps in the USLHS Lighthouse Passports. This is for two reasons. First, the NPS stamps are a separate program with their own passport. Secondly, acceptable stamps for our Lighthouse Passport are available for all lighthouses that also have a NPS cancellation stamp.

In fact, several of them have more than one stamp. Remember, you can include cancellation stamps but they must be in addition to the 60 stamps required for an award level. The locations with new stamps are Cape Hatteras, Bodie Island and Ocracoke lighthouses. Also available, during 2022 only, is a special 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary stamp for Bodie Island. For information regarding when and where all of these are available see their listings on our website. You will have to visit the Outer Banks to get these stamps since they will not be available by mail.

### **New Stamps**

#### Au Sable Light Station, Michigan

The Au Sable Light Station, located in the Pictured Rock National Lakeshore, now has a stamp with a new design. After being closed during Covid, they plan to be open this year from Mid-June to end of September, Wed-Sun, closed Monday/Tuesday. The lighthouse grounds are open year round and are a1.5 mile hike from the Hurricane River campground.



#### **Bolivar Point Lighthouse, TX**



We are excited to have the Bolivar Point Lighthouse Foundation take possession of a stamp with a new design for their Texas lighthouse. The original stamp was designed for the 2012 USLHS Texas tour. Unfortunately, at that time, they were unable to take possession. Keep an eye on the website for

Only early collectors have the first stamp (left image). This is why it is a good idea to always ask if another stamp is available.








## Whitefish Point Light Station

Speaking of old stamps, the current Whitefish Point stamp (at right) did not even identify the lighthouse. This stamp also caused some issues because it would not fit into one square of the passport book. Problem solved! They now have a brand new stamp with a great new design to fit into your book nicely. ## **Lighthouse Tours on Steroids**

While the internet makes it relatively easy to develop your own itinerary for visiting lighthouses, nothing beats participating in one of the tours available from the USLHS. These tours often provide participants an opportunity to visit, view or climb lighthouses that are not accessible to the general public. Examples include Parris Island, Little Cumberland Island and Mary Island lighthouses. Not only are these difficult to



see, but passport stamps for them are only available to tour participants. And, while a stamp may be available for a lighthouse, accessing it may be a different story.
